A Note from the Director

Throughout *Anything Goes*, you will find countless examples of contradictory characterizations. Reno Sweeney, our protagonist, is a sexy nightclub singer and reformed evangelist who leads a festive celebration of the End Times; Moonface Martin, a wanted gangster, successfully poses as a minister, while the real reverend rots in Sing Sing for a case of mistaken identity; all the passengers aboard the SS *American* sing a mock religious hymn, not to God, but to two supposed murderers. The conniving Billy Crocker summarizes all of this absurdity at the end of Act I, musing: "Let me get this straight. If I'm just a stowaway, you throw me in jail. But if I'm a famous murderer, you roll out the red carpet!"

If you find this eerily familiar to the world around you in 2020, you are not alone. The words of the titular song ring out as true now as they did in the immediate aftermath of the Great Depression. "The world has gone mad today, and good's bad today, and black's white today, and day's night today, and most guys today that women prize today are just silly gigolos... anything goes!"

There is a sense of catharsis in embracing the duality of things, despite inherent contradiction. Caesar A. Cruz, renowned international poet and human rights advocate, famously once quipped: "Art should comfort the disturbed and disturb the comfortable." In a similar vein, the Synoptic Gospels tell us that Jesus "came to call not those who think they are righteous, but those who know they are sinners."

Here in modern times, with this production of *Anything Goes*, the Good Shepherd Players celebrate the crazy and revel in the preposterous, uniting around the freeing forces of music, dance, art, and love.

I ask you now not to fear your own confusion! It will all make sense in the end. Or not.
