

Opening Acclamation

Celebrant Blessed is the King that cometh in the name of the Lord.

People Peace in heaven and glory in the highest.

Celebrant Assist us mercifully with thy help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon

the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby thou hast given us life and immortality;

through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People Amen.

The Gospel of the Triumphal Entry Mark 11:1-11

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

"Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

Blessing of the Palms

Celebrant The Lord be with you. People And with thy spirit.

Celebrant Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People It is meet and right so to do.

The Congregation raises palm fronds.

Celebrant It is right to praise thee, Almighty God, for the acts of love by which thou hast redeemed us

through thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who on this day entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph, and was proclaimed as King of kings by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way. Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that

we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leadeth to eternal life; who liveth and reigneth in glory with thee and the Holy Spirit, now and

for ever.

People Amen.

The following is proclaimed three times while waving their palm fronds.

Lesson Philippians 2:5-11

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and

gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.


Psalm 31:9-16 (Chanted by the Choir)

- 9 Have mercy on me, O LORD, for I am in trouble; * my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat and my belly.
- 10 For my life is wasted with grief, and my years with sighing; * my strength fails me because of affliction, and my bones are consumed.
- 11 I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbors, a dismay to those of my acquaintance; * when they see me in the street they avoid me.

The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to Mark

Narrator ... For he realized that it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had

handed him over. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas for them instead. Pilate spoke to them again,

Pilate Then what do you wish me to do with the man you call the King of

the Jews.

Narrator They shouted back,

Crowd Crucify him!

Narrator Pilate asked them,

Pilate Why, what evil has he done?Narrator But they shouted all the more,

Crowd Crucify him!

All stand at the mention of the arrival at Golgotha (The place of a skull).

After the reading, silence is kept.



Celebrant


Together, let us pray.
