#### **Woman Composer Sunday: March 10**

The American Guild of Organists, the UK Society of Women Organists, and the Royal College of Organists will observe the third annual Woman Composer Sunday on March 10. At Good Shepherd, we will recognize the day, Lent 4, with organ music, anthems, and a hymn text by women. The organ prelude is attributed to Maria Theresia von Paradis (1759-1824) and the postlude composed by Margaret Vardell Sandresky (b. 1921). Alice Parker (1925-2023) arranged the two anthems the Senior Choir will sing. Cecil Frances Alexander (1818-1895) wrote the Communion Hymn text to help her students remember portions of the Nicene Creed. All of Sunday's pieces focus on Lenten personal devotional themes of repentance and the wonder of the love of God for the world. That's why they are parts of our service for Lent 4.

## Saturday, March 9, 7:30p (Parish Hall)


