

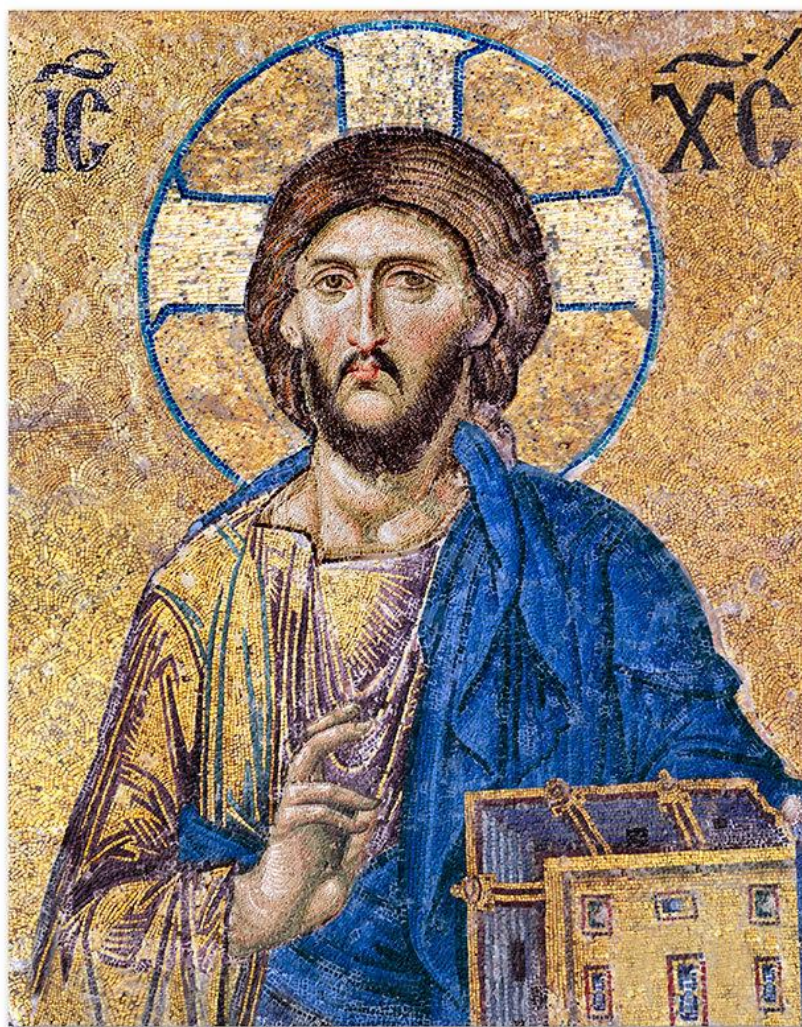

**The Nicene Creed**

*All* We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. 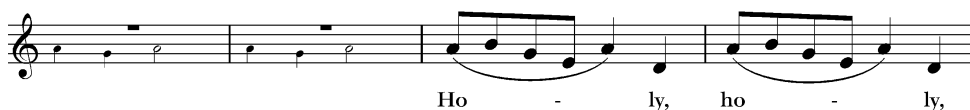



### **Communion Instructions:**


*To receive Communion, offer your cupped hands to receive the host and then proceed to a chalice-bearer to sip from the cup. If you would like Communion by intinction (host dipped in wine), give the appropriate gesture (fingers of one hand in the palm of the other) and the host will be dipped in the wine and offered to you. Also, gluten-free Communion is available, just ask the priest. As always, receiving Communion in one kind (e.g. bread only) is considered full and complete. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, simply cross your arms over your chest. If you would like Communion brought to you in your pew, please inform an usher.*





## MUSIC NOTES BY ALEX BEAN

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Although the 4<sup>th</sup> of July is not a feast day in the Church calendar, I've decided to reference the holiday in my choices of music for prelude and postlude. Our prelude is an original arrangement of "Fanfare for the Common Man" by Aaron Copland (1900-1990). This piece is straightforward, with a single main fanfare theme presented as a solo, then is subsequently elaborated over the course of the piece. Our postlude is from "Variations on America" by Charles Ives (1874-1954). Because the piece is somewhat lengthy, at nearly ten minutes in full, I am playing only the prelude, the main theme, and the final variation. The tune that Ives labels "America" is more commonly known as "National Hymn" or by its incipit "My Country 'Tis of Thee". In this piece Ives heavily draws upon the traditions of march music, especially the more bombastic circus marches.

In contrast to the two more recent pieces our offertory is "Orsus a Coup" ("At the outset") by Andrea Gabrieli (1533-1585) The piece is an arrangement or setting of a French *chanson*, or four-part harmony song, by then-contemporary composer Thomas Créquillon. Gabrieli preserves almost all of the notes of Créquillon's piece but adds fast ornamentation to create more excitement and to make the piece more suitable for keyboard than for voice.
